RULES FOR PUBLIC USE OF THE FAIR GROUNDS

Effective 03/10/2020

Thank you for coming to the Fairgrounds as our guest...

We ask that you respect our rules so you can continue to use the facilities at your convenience.

WHEN YOU ENTER THE KODIAK FAIRGROUNDS, YOU ARE ACCEPTING RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILDREN AND/OR LEGAL GUARDIANS AS STATED IN:

AK ST SS 09.65.145 Liability for injuries or death resulting from livestock activities and AK ST SS 09.65290 Civil liability for sports or recreational activities

Blatant disregard for these rules will result in legal action as deemed necessary by the KRSF Board. 1st offense will result in a verbal warning.

2nd offense will result in a written warning.

3rd offense will result in the revoking of Fairground privileges/usage.

Hours: 6:00 a.m. through 11:00 p.m. Exceptions permitted with the advisement of management (Caretakers, Board President, and Boarder's Facilitators) such as sick horses, late arrivals/departures, and scheduled activities.

Vehicle Speed Limit - 10 M.P.H. inside the gates of the Fairgrounds; 15 M.P.H. between the road and the Fairground gates. Drive slowly for obvious safety reasons.

General Membership Responsibilities — while on Fairgrounds property as a boarder or general use of grounds it is your responsibility to remain in good standing with other boarders/people on the grounds. Shall your behavior become incompatible with others on the grounds above actions will be enforced. Disregard to rules listed or disregard to Caretakers, Facilitators or Board Members shall result in above actions being taken and/or hearing before the KRSF Board and said party. Once membership is revoked or permission to use grounds have been revoked immediate vacating is required by you and no action shall be taken against other parties involved.

General Safety:

Children under the age of 16 years are to be supervised by a designated adult at all times. No children shall be left unattended at any time.

- ASTM/SEI certified helmets are required all times when participating in equine jumping activities as well as when riding in an equine vehicle as driver or passenger.
- It is required that children under the age of 18 years wear ASTM/SEI certified helmets at all times when riding on horseback or in equine vehicle. A KRSF, Inc. Equine Helmet Waiver of Liability is available for those under the age of 18 and must be signed, and recognized by a Director of the KRSF, Inc. Board before being in effect. Completed and approved waivers will be filed in the KRSF, Inc. office. Waivers are not permitted for equine jumping or equine driving activities.
- It is strongly recommended that all riders wear ASTM/SEI certified helmets at all times when riding.

No smoking in the Arena Buildings, Barns, Sheds, Exhibit Hall, or Pan-abode.

Bonfires are permitted in the pit (BBQ) by Exhibit Hall with permission of the facilitators and proper supervision. The KRSF, INC. board representative shall approve all other fires. Borough burn permits are required for any fires not located in the BBQ pit.

Possession and/or use of a controlled substance, under age drinking of alcoholic beverages or any other illegal activity per State code will not be tolerated and will result in immediate removal from fair ground property and any future use of the Fair grounds for a period of one year.

No glass containers are allowed outside of vehicles.

All Dogs must be on leash at all times within the gates of the Fairgrounds, with the exception of the caretaker's dogs during nightly rounds or ground rounds after daylight hours.

ATV's, motorbikes, race cars, etc. are only allowed inside the Kodiak Island Racing Assn. track gates. With the exception of fairgrounds maintenance workers.

Use of Facilities:

Prior approval must be obtained from KRSF Board to use the Fair grounds facilities* with the arrangement of:

- 1. Fees to be paid
- 2. Signed "User Agreement" provided by KRSF, Inc.
- 3. Proof of insurance prior to use

*Facilities include but are not limited to: Arenas, Exhibit Hall, Lion's Den, Pan-abode Office, Round Pen, Parking Lot, Barns, Cow Pasture, etc. Payments due at time of use.

ALCOHOL POLICY

According to Alaska state law alcoholic beverages may not be brought to a public event at the Kodiak State Fairgrounds for consumption by the public without proper permitting by the state.

AS 04.16.090(a): A person may not maintain a place in which alcoholic beverages are received or kept, or to which alcoholic beverages are brought, for consumption by members of the public or by members of a club, corporation, or association, unless the person is authorized to do so under this title.

Any fees charged by User in conjunction with the use of the arena (clinics, lessons, etc.) and/or any other area of the fairgrounds will assessed a 10% user fee to be paid the KRSF, Inc. Arrangements for an hourly or daily rate can be negotiated with KRSF, Inc. in advance of reserved use of the arena and/or grounds.

Use of the arenas is \$5/ hour per rider. Facility use membership options are available. For more information on memberships go to www.kodiakrodeoandstatefair.com or the Kodiak Rodeo and State Fair Facebook page. All users must sign in at the time of use and sign and annual release waiver. Fees and waivers can be placed in the locked box by the sign in sheet.

The indoor arena is NOT available for exclusive (reserved) use on Sunday. Any other exclusive (reserved) use of the indoor arena MUST be scheduled with KRSF Board as stated above.

As a common courtesy if there are more than six (6) users in the indoor arena, please limit your time to one hour.

Avoid contact with any animal that is not your own, unless you have permission from animal's owner. Boarder's Facilitators as well as caretakers may enter pastures in the event of an emergency and must make every effort to contact horse owner immediately. Boarder's must ensure that Facilitators and Caretakers have up to date contact information at all times as that will be the information accessed to contact boarders in the event of emergency or contact needed.

Any equipment used in the arenas must be removed prior to the rider leaving the fairgrounds.

Do not use other people's equipment, horse, or belongings unless permitted otherwise.

Camping is only permitted with prior approval of the Board.

No personal equipment may be stored in horse's pastures other than items needed for the daily care of the horse(s), unless approved by the KRSF Board President or Boarder's Facilitators.

Only feed and tack are to be stored in barn stalls unless approved by KRSF Board President or Boarder's Facilitators.

Horse Safety:

No horse shall be ridden with halter and lead line# outside of pastures, arenas or round pen.

All horses shall be led to and from pastures, barns, and arenas with either a halter and lead rope or a bridle.

No riding horses in Barn and Arena aisles. Horses will enter through the roll up doors when organized spectator events are in progress.

No horses are allowed in the people only areas, i.e. midway, food booths, during the fair or other designated events.

No Stallions may be boarded at the facilities.

Pregnant Mares and/or foals require KRSF Board approval prior to boarding at the facilities.

All horses MUST be fed daily and have access to frost free water.

Animal Care:

New horses that are diseased or sick will NOT be permitted on the grounds. For animals coming from outside the state of Alaska the KRSF, Inc. Board requires a veterinarian health certification stating the animal is healthy and free of disease prior to the arrival of the animal on the fairgrounds as well as proof of vaccines & coggins. (Borough Code Section 6.04.025). No animal outside of the State of Alaska shall be allowed to enter the fairgrounds without the Facilitators approval of documentation. These costs include those relating to infecting of other animals permanently boarded at the Fair grounds. See the rules for boarding acceptance in the Horse Boarder's Protocol (revised 2015).

New boarders or current boarders bringing new horses onto the Fairgrounds shall refer to Boarder Protocol for correct steps in securing a spot on the grounds and are subject to Facilitator and KRSF Board approval.

Do not turn out or put away another person's horse nor enter another boarder's pasture without that person's consent, in case of an emergency notify the Caretakers or Facilitators immediately. Facilitators as well as caretakers may enter pastures in the event of an emergency and must make every effort to contact horse owner immediately. Boarder's must ensure that Facilitators and Caretakers have up to date contact information at all times as that will be the information accessed to contact boarders in the event of emergency or contact needed.

No excessive force, abuse, or restraint is to be used on horses boarded at this facility. The KRSF Board has the final decision on whether excessive force, abuse, or restraint has been used and what action shall be taken.

You are responsible for cleaning up after your animal(s) in the covered arena, round pen, tacking areas, and aisle ways. Manure shall be dumped in the designated area only.

Stalls and pens shall be cleaned once per day or more as needed; shelters once a day or more as needed.

Facility Safety:

Do not stand or sit on gates or arena fencing.

Return all tools and equipment to their proper storage space.	

Motor equipment may only be used with the permission of Board approved equipment operator (

Keep all aisle ways and public use areas clean of hay, manure, and debris.

Garbage MUST be hauled away from the Fairgrounds by the user.

Water – Freezing weather instructions from October 15-April 30:

- Hoses cannot remain connected to hydrants during freezing weather.
- Disconnect hose immediately after use or freeze damage will result.
- Drain all water from hose before returning to storage.
- Hydrants are "frost-free". The valve is below the frost line. The exposed pipe drains back to the valve when the valve is turned off. The hydrant will not drain if the hose is attached.

Make sure lights are turned off when through in the barns, arena, and exhibit hall.

All gates (arena, round pen, pasture, etc.), stall and feed doors must be securely latched upon entering and exiting.

Leave the area in the same or better condition than when you arrived.
