## Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Rules \& Regulations

## Read All Rules and Regulation Guidelines Carefully!

## General Fair Rules:

1. All persons entering the Fair Grounds must pay admission fees.
2. The Fair Board of Directors makes rules and regulations and uses diligence to promote safety of visitors and exhibits. In addition, we ask every person on the grounds to use good judgment and caution in order to promote the safety of themselves and of others. Beyond this, in no case will the Fair Board of Directors be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury that may occur.
3. Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board reserves the right to remove any person(s) from the premises for causing a public disturbance or being a public nuisance.
4. No loose animals will be tolerated on the grounds.
5. Only authorized vehicles will be allowed within the grounds.
6. Fair Grounds stable facilities are available on a first come/first served basis. Contact Barn Manager for more information.

## Entries Rules:

1. Entries are open to all people.
2. Entries for premiums and ribbons will be limited to those classes listed in the official premium list. Unless otherwise specified, when three (3) or more like items are entered in the "Other" class, the superintendent and/or judge may designate these like items as another official class for judging and awards. No exhibit may be entered in both Open Class and 4-H, with the exception of Livestock Showmanship (Livestock Division 1).
3. Entries are to be submitted in the name of the owner, maker, or grower.
4. With the exception of animals, birds, or house plants, no entry may be submitted that has previously been entered at the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair.
5. Participants are encouraged to pre-register their entries. Prior to the week of the fair, you may send the registration form to: KODIAK RODEO \& STATE FAIR BOARD, PO BOX 507, KODIAK AK 99615. An entry form with directions is included in the center of this book. Additional Premium Books will be available from the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board and at business locations throughout Kodiak.
6. Entries will be accepted at the Fair Grounds on the Friday beginning Labor Day weekend, from $12 \mathrm{pm}-6 \mathrm{pm}$. The superintendents of the respective departments will handle entries. There is no entry fee; however, ALL EXHIBITORS OF ANIMALS WILL BE CHARGED A $\$ 10.00$ CLEANING DEPOSIT AT THE TIME OF ENTRY. The fee will be refunded when the assigned stall/pen is cleaned by the exhibitor and inspected by the superintendent during the exhibit release hours at the close of the Fair.
7. Mail or freight entries will be accepted when prepaid and accompanied by instructions for their return. Entries can be sent to: KODIAK RODEO \& STATE FAIR BOARD, PO BOX 507, KODIAK AK 99615. In the case of animals, phone the superintendent of that department prior to shipping.
8. All entries must be entered in the proper department with the information as required by the entry form. An entry submitted in the wrong class will be disqualified.
9. Entries will be released on Sunday of Labor Day weekend between $4-6 \mathrm{pm}$ and shall be removed from the Fair Grounds at that time. NO EXHIBITS SHALL BE RELEASED
PRIOR TO 4 PM. The Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board assumes no responsibility, either expressed or implied, for articles not claimed at the close of the Fair.
10. The Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board and its superintendents will not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
11. An exhibitor shall not submit more than one (1) entry in each class or lot except for "Other," which must be distinctly "Other."
12. No "For Sale" sign will be permitted on any exhibit during the course of the Fair.
13. There will be a definite separation between "Professional," "Non-Professional," "Senior" (60 years + ), and "Junior" (18 and under) exhibitors. A professional exhibit is classified as one that is sold under a current Alaska Business License and/or an established house of business. Professional exhibits may be entered only in competition with other professional exhibits. The Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board will make all final decisions regarding the above rules and regulations.

## Superintendents and Judges:

1. Superintendents are in full charge of their departments and are subject only to the management. All exhibits are under the control of the superintendents. They assign stalls or space and see that all rules are carried out in connection with the judging.
2. It is the superintendent's responsibility to verify the correct completion of exhibit tickets before entry.
3. When there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, judges may award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal or article deserves.
4. The superintendent may exclude the exhibitor from competition. The Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board may withhold any premiums that have been awarded and may expel the participant from further exhibiting at the Fair.
5. No person shall act as a judge or superintendent in any division of class in which there is any direct or indirect interest as owner or agent. If awards are made in violation of this rule, the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board reserves the right to appoint a new judge whose placing of the class in question will supersede the previous scoring.

## Ribbons and Premiums:

1. Ribbons shall be awarded as follows:
a. Grand Champion - one Grand Champion may be awarded in each DEPARTMENT at the discretion of the judges.
b. Merit Award - one Merit Award may be awarded in each DEPARTMENT at the discretion of the judges.
c. Blue Ribbon -One First Place Blue Ribbon may be awarded in each CLASS at the discretion of the judges.
d. Red Ribbon - One Second Place Red Ribbon may be awarded in each CLASS at the discretion of the judges.
e. White Ribbon - One Third Place White Ribbon may be awarded in each CLASS at the discretion of the judges.
2. Other ribbons may be awarded as specified within individual departments.

Premiums will be awarded to all entries with Blue, Red, and White Ribbons except Department B and Department P entries. Green or Participant ribbons may be awarded.
3. Premium checks not cashed within 45 days from date of issue will be voided and the premiums involved cancelled.
4. The Danish system of judging shall prevail throughout the Premium list.

## Protests:

1. All protests must be made in writing and be accompanied by a deposit of $\$ 10$. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.
2. Protest must be received by the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board within 24 hours after the item in protest is opened to the public after judging.
3. Protests must state plainly the cause of complaint under appeal. No appeal based on the statement that the judge(s) is (are) incompetent will be considered by the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board.

## Department A

HORSES \& LIVESTOCK
Animals entered in 4-H cannot be shown in Open Class, with the exception of Division 1. Livestock exhibitors must make arrangements to feed and care for their entries. Stall/ pens and the surrounding area must be kept clean and presentable for public viewing. Failure to keep animals and stall/pens clean may result in forfeiture of all awards and being asked to remove animals from Fair Grounds. Only clean animals in good health are accepted. Animals with infectious, contagious, or communicable conditions are disallowed on the grounds throughout the Fair. Some examples include external parasites, pseudo tuberculosis in goats, and ringworms or warts in cattle. Refund of cleaning deposit will be presented upon inspecting of stall/pens by superintendents. With exception of goats, all animals will remain on the Fair Grounds for the duration of the Fair. Animal must be in exhibitor's possess-ion for at least three (3) months prior to exhibition.

## DIVISION 1 LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP

All exhibitors, Open Class as well as 4-H, are encouraged to participate. All training, fitting, and preparation of the animal prior to and during the Fair is to be done by the contestant. The top Showman from each division may enter the Round Robin Master Showmanship Competition, with Open Class and 4-H being judged together.

Entries must show in boots and/or helmet and safe tack, as appropriate for the Class. All rules set by the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board for horse use and handling apply to all entrants registered in the show.

Failure to keep animals and stalls/pens clean may result in forfeiture of all awards and being asked to remove animals from the Fair Grounds. Only clean animals in good health are accepted. Animals with infectious, contagious, or communicable conditions are disallowed on the grounds throughout the Fair. Animal must be in exhibitor's possession for at least three (3) months prior to exhibition. Refund of cleaning deposit will be presented upon inspection of stalls/pens by superintendent.

Many varieties grown here as annuals, are in fact perennials in warmer climates. New classes will be created if there are three (3) or more entries of the same plant, or if warranted by the superintendent. Containers for cut flowers will be supplied by the Kodiak Rodeo \& State Fair Board. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor. Plants must be in possession of exhibitor for at least three (3) months prior to entry day. Items used in arrangements need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
